Pyrus nivalis

Common Name: 'Snow Pear'

Landscape value:

Like other pears, the Snow Pear is ideal for avenue and street plantings or as a specimen/feature tree in parks and gardens.

Throughout summer the tree is covered in silvery/grey-green leaves, which are distinctively different to other pear varieties. In the autumn these leaves turn a vibrant red.

The colour of the snow pear is ideal for adding contrast to any garden landscape.

Typical size: 8m x 5m

Growth rate: Moderate

Habit: Rounded, well structured

with a straight trunk.

Foliage: Glossy dark green leaves

Flowers: In Spring the tree is covered in small white masses of flowers.

Fruit: -

Position: Full sun

Season of Interest: Spring, Summer and Autumn

Soil Type: Prefers moist but tolerable of most soils once established.

Tolerances/cultivation: Frost tolerant and hardy tree if prepared for trying conditions, i.e. mulched in warm periods.
