## Common Name: 'Pin Oak'

Quercus palustris

## Landscape value:

The Pin Oak has a strong leader which over time develops a loose spreading canopy. Its shape is a distinctive structure whereby upper branches point upwards, middle branches are horizontal and lower branches droop.

The Pin Oak is a popular tree as feature tree in parks and large gardens or for avenue plantings because of its pyramidical form and the deep red colouring in the autumn.

Typical size: 15m x 8m

**Growth rate:** Fast to Moderate

**Habit**: Majestic pyramidal tree with descending lower branches. Suitable for large gardens, parks and streets. Faster growth than other oaks

**Foliage**: Lustrous dark green lobed leaves turning red to crimson in the autumn, can persist through out winter

**Flowers**: Insignificant grey-green to tan male catkin & yellow-green to tan female flower that bloom in late winter

**Fruit:** Stout acorns around 12 mm long with a shallow, saucer-shaped cap

Season of Interest: Autumn

**Position**: Full sun

**Soil Type**: Performs best in well

drained soil

**Tolerances/cultivation**: Very hardy tree, prefers fertile acid soils but is adaptable to most sites, tolerates wet conditions
